


## Community-backed initiative to fund transit improvements





Bexar County (2020-2045)

**922,010** new residents







Silver Line Corridor (2020-2050):

**34,160** new residents

51% increase

**40,010** new jobs

33% increase


## Simplifies trips



# Call to Action: Close the funding gap for VIA Rapid Silver Line

VIA and the community stand to gain approximately \$410M worth of investment from the Federal Transit Administration's Capital Improvement Grant Program if successful.

Local Partnership Funding Required	\$100.5M
VIA Funds	\$42.0M
Federal Funds	\$146.7M
Project Cost (Year of Expenditure)	\$289.2M


