
# **SPANISHFORK** MAIN STREET We come **Main Street Open House** February 19, 5:00 - 7:00pm



## THE PROBLEM

#### CRASHES



Between 2019 and 2024, there were 362 crashes on Main Street between 300 South and 1000 North. Most of those, 354, were intersection related, and nearly half of those were angle crashes, meaning at least one vehicle was turning.








Main Street is congested at various times throughout the day

**The community wants Main Street** to be greener and more inviting








These renderings show the concept design.



These renderings are examples of how the project could look at several locations.




UTA is expanding bus service on Main Street. The city is considering adding bus shelters.



### THE CHALLENGE: EXISTING TREES

Phases 1 & 2 extend from 1000 North to 400 North, with future phases from 400 North to 300 South. The large Sycamore trees on Main Street between Center Street and 100 South are in Phase 3, but alignment changes made in earlier phases will impact trees along the entire corridor. New trees would be planted throughout.
