Aviation Parkway Widening (STIP Project U-5811)

Project Description

The N.C. Department of Transportation (NCDOT) proposes to widen Aviation Parkway (S.R. 1002) from N.C. 54 (Chapel Hill Road) to I-40.

Purpose of the Project: Decrease congestion and improve safety

Adding a second lane in each direction will help decrease congestion on Aviation Parkway and potentially on other east-west roads through this area. The addition of a median will improve safety along the corridor.

Proposed Design


NCDOT proposes to widen Aviation Parkway to a 4-lane median divided roadway with curb and gutter. Extra wide outside lanes will accommodate bicycles. Existing sidewalks will be replaced, and NCDOT and the towns may partner to add new sidewalk and a multi-use trail along the rest of the corridor. The graphic below shows the proposed typical section.

A sidewalk or multi-use trail could be added behind the curb on both sides.

Design Considerations

There are several issues NCDOT will consider during the design process, including:

- Changes to business access Adding a median will change many full-movement driveways to right-in/right-out only.
- Crossing the railroad NCDOT will coordinate with the rail agencies to determine the most feasible alternative across the tracks.
- Community resources Impacts will be minimized on community resources such as places of worship, parks, and greenways.
- Crossing Lake Crabtree Designs will be considered to limit impacts to the lake.
- Other natural resources Impacts will be minimized or mitigated to streams, wetlands, and floodplains.
- Coordinating with adjacent projects —
 Several NCDOT and Town of Morrisville
 projects are underway nearby, as described on
 the back of this handout. Although the NCDOT
 STIP project limits end at N.C. 54, the study
 corridor extends further west so there is not a
 gap between adjacent projects.

Other Projects in the Area

Several other proposed projects intersect with Aviation Parkway, as shown on the figure to the right. Information about each project is below.

- McCrimmon Parkway Extension
 (Project U-5828) the Town of Morrisville
 proposes to extend McCrimmon Parkway
 from Airport Boulevard to Aviation
 Parkway/Evans Road. This will be a 4-lane
 median divided road with bike lanes and
 8-foot wide sidewalks on both sides.
 Design is anticipated to be complete this
 summer. Right of way acquisition will
 begin this summer, and construction is
 anticipated to begin in spring 2017.

- Morrisville-Carpenter Road Widening

 the Town of Morrisville proposes to
 widen existing Morrisville-Carpenter Road
 from Town Hall Drive to Davis Drive. This
 will be a 4-lane median divided road with
 wide outside lanes and sidewalks on both
 sides. Design is anticipated to be complete
 at the end of this year. Construction and
 right of way are not currently funded.



- I-40 Managed Lanes (Project I-5702B)

 NCDOT proposes to construct managed lanes from N.C. 147 (Durham Freeway/ Triangle Expressway) to Wade Avenue.
 Planning is underway. Right of way is scheduled to begin in FY 2024, and construction is "post years" (unfunded) in the 2016-2025 STIP. [Contact: Ahmed

- I-40/Aviation Parkway Interchange (Project I-5506) — NCDOT proposes to construct a loop ramp in the northwest quadrant of the interchange. Final designs are underway. Right of way is scheduled to begin in FY 2017, and construction is scheduled to begin in FY 2018. [Contact: Gene Tarascio, NCDOT Project Development, gtarascio@ncdot.gov or 919-707-6046.]
- N.C. 54 And More Feasibility Study (Project FS-1005B) - NCDOT, Morrisville, Cary, Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO), and Norfolk Southern are studying potential improvements to N.C. 54 between N.C. 540 and NW Maynard Road.
