


11.7 miles from Airport Area to Missions Area





17 new articulated low/noemission vehicles




Center running, business access and transit lanes, and mixed traffic lanes

Station Amenities





- O1 Adds sidewalks for safe station access and eliminates sidewalk gaps
- 02 Improves traffic signal timing for people walking and biking
- 04 Improves pedestrian crossing conditions
- Adds infrastructure improvements in high injury areas including managing turns along the corridor









How transit is funded in Texas

In 1973, the Texas Legislature authorized up to 1% local sales tax for transit (MTA).


In 1977, San Antonio voters approved the creation of the first MTA in Texas, VIA, funded by a 1/2 cent (0.5%) sales tax.
