Project Overview



Route 460 between Commerce Drive and Leatherwood Lane.

Anticipated Cost – Approximately \$5 million Purpose – Improve safety From – 0.194-mile west of Commerce Street To – 0.147-mile east of Leatherwood Lane Total length – 0.772 mile Anticipated Schedule – Right of Way – no right of way purchases required; advertise for construction bids – February 2024.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The primary purpose of this project is to improve safety on a portion of Route 460, located between Commerce Drive and Leatherwood Lane in Bluefield.

At both the Commerce Drive and Leatherwood Lane intersections, offset left turn lanes will be added as well as new traffic signals. Offset left turn lanes shift left-turning traffic closer to oncoming traffic to increase sight distance.

Minor drainage modifications will also be performed during the project.

Through VDOT's SMART SCALE program, the project was allocated approximately \$5 million District Grant program funds.

Once the public involvement opportunity and location and design of the project wraps up, the project will be advertised for construction bids in early 2024. This portion of Route 460 carries approximately 16,000 vehicles per day.

Environmental Review

Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), 23 CFR 771, and the 2022 Agreement between the Federal Highway Administration and VDOT, a Programmatic Categorical Exclusion (PCE) was prepared for this project and is available for review. All subsequent environmental conditions and commitments resulting from regulatory approvals will be adhered to during project construction.

Right of Way

No right of way and easements will be needed to accommodate the construction. The project will be performed within the current right of way.
