Patton Ave Coxe to Asheland ADA Improvements

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Key Takeaways

- The City of Asheville (COA) has available Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds that need to be spent in order to meet Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) timeliness requirements.
- The Community Development Division identified unallocated CDBG funds and recommended funding public facilities, public improvement projects, and projects that improve accessibility in order to achieve compliance with CDBG program timeliness requirements.
- After the submission of proposed accessibility projects from multiple City departments, the Community
 Development Division determined that the accessibility project located at 108 Patton Avenue was the best fit for
 reallocation of \$300,000 in CDBG funds.
- Proposed activities are expected to be completed by April 2024, and will be funded from recaptured prior years' unobligated CDBG funds.
- This action requires an amendment to the HUD Annual Action Plan in order to proceed with the project.



Eligibility - 108 Patton Ave

- Community Development staff met with multiple City departments to discuss projects in their capital plans that would meet HUD CDBG requirements and address accessibility concerns.
- After reviewing all proposed projects for CDBG eligibility, benefit, and overall cost, staff is recommending that
 the accessibility project located at 108 Patton Avenue (between Coxe and Asheland) should be considered for
 funding at the estimated price of \$300,000. The proposed improvements are sidewalk and curb ramp
 replacement on both sides of Patton Avenue.
- This project is located in an area that has access to multiple essential services including: the Federal building, Buncombe County Health and Human Services, U.S. Post Office, banks, and is less than a block away from the Asheville Rides Transit station.
- Proposed activity is consistent with the goals and objectives of the CDBG program and was identified as a top
 priority in the City's GAP Plan


















Staff Recommendation
