



I've really enjoyed the quieter summer this year. Promoting higher number of visitors only benefits a handful of businesses. After that we are dealing with the lack of infrastructure to support more tourism. I work in the service industry and tourism funds my existence here, but there is a limit to how much I benefit. The insane cost of living here, lack of housing for locals, traffic going in and out of Alpine and over Teton Pass, the quality of experience within the parks, at restaurants and hotels are all negatively impacted by having too many tourists that our infrastructure does not support. It's an equation of diminishing returns.

It would be great to see more resources available for tourists such as RV parts and related products available in stores, as well as RV repair people and other businesses who actually answer the phone or return calls. Also, there are many seemingly well-paid job positions in town but once you factor in the average cost to own or rent, it's obvious why there is an employee shortage here. It's pretty sad when a local bank can't keep it's own hours.

We retired here almost four years ago and planned to do a lot of volunteering to keep ourselves busy. Instead, we found ourselves renting out the finished basement for a modest sum for the area because we had extra space and were appalled at the housing conditions and highway robbery of workers. What happened to helping the next generation? I started "helping out" at a local resort only to find how desperately they needed staff just to cover events that were sold. It is impossible to keep up ratings when there is no staff to provide service.

I can't believe the county can function much longer when there are so many openings. 3 out of 4 building inspector positions are open, yet the county thinks they are offering good pay which is equivalent to pay at Target for a job that has a lot less stress than a professional career. Personal Finance 101... housing should be 30% of your pay. The residents, employers and elected officials need to ensure that workers are paid enough to afford to have their basic human needs met and then limit the amount of short term rentals so there is housing available for people.



As a resident of Teton County, Idaho, it has been difficult to watch JH offload its issues to our community – thus creating the same and exacerbating the same issues within our community. Businesses in Idaho struggle to staff themselves and house employees due in part to the number of housing units occupied by workers driving to Jackson.

As a resident of the area at large, I no longer travel over Teton Pass unless absolutely necessary during the summer months – Jackson itself is no longer a pleasant experience. Traffic, crowding, and incessant construction of new luxury accommodations (both hotels and residences) have made the place that I initially moved to virtually unrecognizable. The fabric of locals is shrinking rapidly, being replaced by an elite group that care little for the community during the few weeks a year that they "live" here.

Instead of slapping up more of the chicken-coop-type housing that changes the character of the Town costing millions in tax-payer dollars in the process, how about increasing the number of commuter bus routes, paying drivers a livable wage, and spreading the workforce over the valley? Several of my employees don't want to live in Jackson because of the crowds, the expense, and the entitlement. The housing genie is already out of the bottle. We're not fixing it with more condos. Packing in more and more workers to satisfy tourists just creates different kinds of problems. As more long-time residents are forced out, they are being replaced by those newly-relocated zoomers who don't care about the character of the town. They just want convenience.


