WEATHERIZATION

- Provider: Green Built Alliance*
- Annual Allocation: \$100,000 (\$50,000 County Sustainability Office + \$100,000 City of Asheville)
- Average Annual Impact: 100 Income-Qualified Households with High Energy Cost Burden (40% BIPOC Households Goal)
- Weatherization provides energy efficient upgrades which can include: Blower door testing, insulation, air sealing, efficient lighting, efficient water fixtures, and minor repairs
- Average Cost Per Home: \$850
- Total Homes Served: 1000+
- Total HACA Apartments Served: 88
- Average Annual/Monthly Cost Savings Per Home: \$195.00 / \$16.25

*Services re-bid every 3 years





WEATHERIZATION

Program Eligibility

- Rent or own a mobile or single-family home in Buncombe County
- Household income must <200% of Federal Poverty Guidelines*
- Provide total household income (at least 1 proof of income for each adult household member)

ELECTRIFY ASHEVILLE BUNCOMBE

- Providers: Bright Spaces, NC Clean Energy Fund, City/County
- Current Resources: \$184,000
 - Sustainability Office: \$142,000
 - City of Asheville Funding: \$42,000
- Joint venture to develop an "Electrification Marketplace" for residents to begin their journey toward decarbonizing their homes. Access to free evaluations and vetted local contractor network.
- NC Clean Energy Fund is enabling better than market rate financing for qualified residents though Self-Help Credit Union, accepts credit scores below 600.

HCCBG HOUSING & HOME IMPROVEMENTS

Program: State funding providing minor repairs to owner and renter occupied homes to individuals age 60+

Categories of Home Improvement Services:

- Security enhancements
- Minor home repairs
- Mobility and accessibility improvements
- Basic household furnishings and home appliance repair, replacement or purchase

FY 25 Restrictions on Project Amounts:

• Cap FY 25: \$7,000

Allocation Process:

- Applications for funding received each spring
- Reviewed by the HCCBG Advisory Committee
- Recommended funding levels provided to Budget Office
- Approved by Buncombe County Board of Commissioners



HCCBG HOUSING & HOME IMPROVEMENTS

Provider: Mountain Housing Opportunities

Funding: \$228,705 (FY 23- \$88,318; FY 24-\$75,448 & Recommendation FY25 - \$64,939)

Impact: 91 households (65 households FY23 & 26 households FY24)

Projects: Repairing floors, installing safety grab bars, installing low rise stairs and/or ramps (fall risk reduction), appliance/water heater replacement, etc.

Average Investment Per Home: \$2,513.00 (\$1,358 (FY23) and (FY24) \$2,901.85)

Note: Funds cannot be used to pay for rent, utility bills, food, medicine, security deposits, utility deposits, taxes, home improvements negatively affecting the structural integrity of the home, home improvements that are the obligation of the landlord, or duplication of any home improvement service to the same housing unit for three (3) consecutive years following receipt of the initial service

HCCBG HOUSING & HOME IMPROVEMENTS

Provider: United Community Development of NC, Urgent Home Repair Program (new for FY 25)

Funding: \$15,278.00 (Recommendation FY25- received 25% of request)

Proposed Impact: Max of \$4,000 per family unit

Target Population: Individuals 60 plus, low income, and primarily African Americans who live in the legacy neighborhoods of Asheville and Buncombe County. Provide maintenance to homes/trailers with deferred maintenance issues due to systemic poverty and system of exclusion.

Projects: Repair damaged or rotten steps/drywall/floors, install grab bars, wheelchair ramps, install handicap accessible toilets, hot water heaters, etc.

BUNCOMBE COUNTY SUPPLEMENTAL AGING FUNDS

BCSAF funds total \$500,000 for FY 25 and are also allocated by the HCCBG Advisory Committee/approved by County Commissioners. The application process is the same as HCCBG.

These funds are to supplement and fund services outside of the allowable HCCBG categories and may include the following: services that identify unmet need or gap in service; services that approach old problems in new ways; new, innovative or non-traditional collaborations; existing collaborations to operate in new ways.

Provider: Eblen Charities – Stability for Older Adults (new for FY25)

Funding: \$18,444.00 for FY25

Target Population: 60 plus living at or below 60% of the median income

Proposed Impact: Max of \$1500 per household

Projects: prevent evictions and maintain working utilities by assisting with bills paid directly to the vendor; refer individuals to other services/resources they may qualify for to meet unmet needs

- Eligibility: Individuals/families who have experience financial hardship due to or during COVID and income less than 80% AMI
- Source: Emergency Rental Assistance Funding federal & state funds
- Funding: \$ 23,497,351.10 (\$657,745.02 remaining)
- Impact: 6,241 Individuals/families (complete), 1,247 pending











COUNTY AFFORDABLE HOUSING EFFORTS & FUNDING UPDATE: COMBINED INVESTMENTS

AFFORABLE HOUSING GOALS

- 1. Increase the supply of Affordable Housing for rent
- 2. Increase the supply of Affordable Housing for homeownership, especially for BIPOC households
- 3. Preserve the supply of Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing (NOAH)
- 4. Support activities that achieve functional zero Homelessness
- 5. Support activities that encourage the use of all vouchers


AFFORABLE HOUSING OBJECTIVES

Buncombe County will impact 2,800-3,150 affordable housing units by 2030.

- 1,500-1,850 rental units for households at ≤ 80% AMI
 - average at ≤ 60% AMI across all households
 - 1,200-1,480 units should leverage the LIHTC program (will leverage an estimated \$100 \$120 million in tax credit equity to Buncombe Co.)
 - 200 units for <30% AMI
- 400 ownership units for households at ≤ 80% AMI
- 500 repair units for households at ≤ 80% AMI
- 400 ownership or rental units for households at > 80% to ≤ 120% AMI

IMPACT ON HOUSING GOAL RENTAL UNITS FOR HOUSEHOLDS AT ≤80% AMI



GOAL = 1,480






IMPACT ON HOUSING GOAL OWNERSHIP UNITS FOR <80% AMI

GOAL = 200






IMPACT ON HOUSING GOAL
