Meeting Minutes

Commissioner Sloan called the meeting to order at 10:02 am.

Motion to approve May minutes and July agenda made by Councilperson Ullman. Approved unanimously.

Public Comment:

No public comment.

Buncombe County Clean Water Fund Criteria

- Funding range
 - Staff preference is to increase minimum for proposals. Limited capacity to manage more than 3 projects well.
 - Concern raised that if there is only 1 project, does that limit the ability of a pilot to demonstrate success
 - Support for allowing proposals up to \$100K to see what we get
 - Add disclaimer that preference will be given to 2-3 medium projects
 - Available funding should align with requirements (construction drawings are expensive)
- Being a pilot program with limited funds, requiring WAP-approved projects will vet the projects, ensure a level of shovel-readiness, and limit applicant pool
 - Preapproved WAPs include: Smith Mill Creek, Cane Creek, DT sections of French Broad
- Discussion around accepting in-kind as matching funds
 - What are the equity implications? Would disqualifying in-kind funds create exclusivity?
 - Not accepting in-kind may limit applicant pool to more experienced partners during pilot
 - Suggestion to allow for flexibility- the more match you bring, the more points you get
- Timeline discussion-
 - Currently funds are not in a roll-over funding meaning projects need to be done by June
 - o Completing in FY24 would allow subcommittee to see results before funding in FY25
 - Ideally, in the future, this program gets on the same timeline as Strategic Partnerships Grants
 - Support from subcommittee to move to a carry-over fund and extend the proposed deadlines
 - The permitting process can take several months

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- Trout moratoriums and other restrictions can cause project delays
- Prosed new 18-month timeline
 - Reasonable release date: 1 month
 - Advertise for 1 month, 2 weeks at a minimum
 - 1 month to rally review committee
- Staff will review and do the scoring and bring to the subcommittee for final decision
 - o Subcommittee members value the notes from staff in addition to the scores
- Some support for more flexible use of funds. Instead of requiring construction drawings, maybe let that be an acceptable use of funds
- Clarify that criteria disallowing studies/ testing is for water quality, not engineering. Intent is to invest in implementation, not planning or pre-planning.

Greenbank Pilot Update

- NC Green Bank is applying for federal funds- it could be up to a year before they see any funds that they are awarded
- Next step is to initiate contract with Clean Energy Fund for the loan loss reserve
- Identifying portal for contractor registration
 - Smart-e may or may not still be an option- they are looking to only do larger, state-wide programming which increases cost
- Clean Energy Fund staff have met with capital partners (CDFIs, BOA) in Asheville
- County Staff are working to queue contractors and clients
 - Currently negotiating contract with Solar Crowd Source
 - Modify solarize model to other technologies like heat pumps
 - Tapping contractor networks- Duke Trade Allies are already trained on leveraging rebates/ incentives
- Both City and County ARPA funds have been dedicated to HVAC replacements through GBA. May be an opportunity to fully subsidize a handful of these projects.
- Contractors have expressed need for better financing options
- Won't see cost reduction from volume because there are so many different heat pumps- more of mass marketing, facilitation of federal/ utility rebates, and a financing product
- Fully anticipate stubbing our toe- be realistic about what our expectations
 - Still deciding what success looks like: 50 projects? 100 projects?- How many will want financing? How do we leverage the fund?
 - Success is innovation
 - People don't pursue this product when everything is functional, they wait until it breaks
 - Provide safety net for the market to develop
- Timeline-
 - Can we roll it out this winter?
 - EPA electrification messaging is also focusing on summer AC
- Make sure State CPR (climate pollution reduction) plan includes electrification so there is future grant funding available- EAQ to facilitate this
- Solar Crowd Source received funding previously allocated to Green Built Alliance
 - Same amount of funding available for BHP

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- $\circ~$ Shifting some funding away weatherization
- Heat pump hot waters wouldn't be good candidate tech for financing
- GBA has built capacity through ARPA
- Shifting our priorities to meet new unprecedented opportunities
- GBA will be able to modify their ARPA funds
- Buncombe County was first to commit funds to Clean Energy Fund= top priority

Response to Wildfire Impacts to Air Quality

- Several code orange days and forecasted code orange days
- Predicting that fires will burn all summer and we will continue to have the air quality issues
- Air Quality has been meeting with Emergency Services, CAPE, DHHS
- County staff support EPA messaging- using their outreach materials
- CAPE prepared a toolkit to distribute air quality messaging (i.e. no burning)
- No reports from local hospitals about impacts to human health
- Working with local professor using low cost air sensors to monitor local conditions- study on redlined areas= more data than 2016
- Recommendations for folks who cant stay inside: look out for symptoms, take frequent breaks, check with doctor about using respirator
 - When we get to reds and purples- what will that mean for County/ City work crews?
- County is not allowed to distribute KN95 masks, supposed to be respiratory fit tested for N95
- Air Now fire and smoke map is the recommended resource

Announcements:

- Recap of the Plastic bag ban discussion
 - Decision was to go into close session
 - City is pursing with eagerness and calculated risk
 - \circ $\;$ Risk of state coming at us when being innovative with law
 - Do County Governments have legal authority to implement proposed ban? Groups have committed to sue
 - o Staff is working on alternative pivots to focus on projects within County authority
 - Closed session is just to hear about legal authority- other discussion (merits) will happen in open meetings
